2.	<p>Co-Option of Karen Allen</p> <p>The co-option of Karen Allen was proposed by Ian Hunter, and seconded by Ditta Neumann, and agreed by all.</p>	
3.	<p>Minutes of the meeting held on May 8th 2007</p> <p>Item 3, second paragraph. The last sentence was incorrect and it was agreed it should be deleted.</p> <p>Lyn Jardine asked that her name be spelt correctly and consistently.</p> <p>The police officer present was Constable Stuart Akers (Community Beat Officer)</p> <p>With these amendments, their adoption was proposed by James Cleves and seconded by Lyn Jardine and agreed unanimously.</p>	
4.	<p>Crime Prevention – Report by Police</p> <p>Constable Akers and a member of the public discussed STORM incidents. STORM is the police record of all calls from the public.</p> <p>A datasheet was produced containing the crime rates within Stonehaven over the past few months. Ditta Neumann enquired as to why there was such a high crime rate the same month as the Feein’ market and if they could possibly be related. Constable Akers replied stating figures did vary widely from period to period, and no correlation was sensible.</p> <p>Constable Akers commented on the effectiveness of the drive incentive where £120 worth of safety kits were provided to young drivers, which were very much appreciated. Further to this when vehicles were checked for safety many faults were discovered. These included loud exhausts, worn tyres and overly tinted windows.</p> <p>Constable Akers reported on the progress being made on the youth street football which is planned to meet every Wednesday during the summer holidays. He is also looking into the possibility of there being Friday or Saturday meetings.</p>

5.	<p>Former Stonehaven Radio Station Site - raised by Alistair MacLean, a member of the public.</p> <p>Mr. MacLean spoke about the Radio station site stating that he feels people should look after the buildings. In particular, he felt that the owners (BT) should make more of an effort to ensure the preservation of the building.</p> <p>Historic Scotland visited the site last week and also felt that the site was in a bad state; Mr MacLean suggested that Aberdeenshire Council uses its statutory power to buy the building and to help guarantee its preservation. In addition, he feels a sub-group should be created for this issue. However members of S&DCC stated that there were simply not enough people available to do that. Mr MacLean wanted to set up a meeting of interested parties, but was not able to pay the required hire fee of £40. The Community Council, in supporting his idea, agreed to provide meeting rooms to overcome this issue.</p> <p>Cllr. Wendy Agnew reported that a letter has been sent from Aberdeenshire Council to the owners of the site, giving them 14 days to secure the site. However, there has been no response so far.</p> <p><i>Motion: This council wishes to have the Former Stonehaven Radio Station maintained and secured.</i></p> <p>Proposed by David Fleming, seconded by David Wood. 6.	<p>Recycling point at the Leisure Centre Car Park - raised at the request of Allan Sutherland, a member of the public</p> <p>Allan Sutherland stated that people are continuing to dump rubbish at the recycling point. This is fly-tipping, and gives a very bad view on the approach to Stonehaven. A number of options were proposed, discussed and then voted on individually.</p> <p>a) Remove the large skip designated for cardboard</p> <p>It was reported that most of the flytipping was beside the large blue skip. Cllr. Mike Sullivan stated that the blue skip was the only place for cardboard at the site, and felt that people will be put off recycling as they would have to make more of an effort to do so. There then was a debate as to whether the Leisure Centre car park was the best location. Cllr. Wendy Agnew suggested that the Mill Lade could be used, but it was pointed out that that also was visible as one entered the Town, and was less open to public surveillance. Cllr. Graeme Clark pointed out that most of the recyclable material starts off at a supermarket, and it was logical to provide space at the Somerfield's supermarket. Therefore a further item was debated that:

e) The Recycling Point should be relocated to the Somerfield supermarket car park.

The motion was carried, all approving, apart from David Fleming who abstained because of a declaration of interest.

Then the main motion, suitably amended, was put.

This Community Council wishes to see urgent improvements in the Recycling Facility at the Leisure Centre Car Park, and wishes Aberdeenshire Council to:

a) install CCTV to monitor the usage of the site

b) install clear signs explaining the use of the site, that fly tipping is illegal and anyone caught will be prosecuted

c) consider moving the whole site to the Car Park at the Somerfield's supermarket.

This main motion, as amended, was proposed by Lynda Digney, seconded by Jane Davidson, and agreed unanimously.

7. Sewerage Upgrade Scheme

Ian Downie was unable to attend. David Fleming passed out copies of his progress report (attached to the minutes). No comments were made.

The warning signs at the west end of the High Street have been put up.

Lyn Jardine, Ian Balgowan and Michael Innes wish to be kept in touch about the use of Gas works site as temporary parking.

The Cowie Bridge design specification is in the process of being produced. David stated that he hopes it is not only the bridge but also the surrounding area that will be improved and become aesthetically pleasing. In addition to this, the bridge will be roughly 30% wider than the previous bridge and there is also the possibility of a viewing platform halfway along the bridge.

Once the design brief has been agreed by Aberdeenshire Council and Balfour Beatty, the manufacturer can be informed and the actual design work started. In reply to Ian Hunter, David Fleming said that the design would be subject to further public consultation.

This application will come up for determination at the end of month. The Community Council has asked to speak to its objections

9.4 Field 52

There is to be an open meeting on the 21st June (since postponed to 12th July) inviting a range of people (included all Councillors) to come to discuss current plans.

9.5 The application has been submitted, but details are not yet on the website (after over 4 weeks since submission). Cllr. Agnew stated that this delay was due to staff shortages in the Planning Dept.

10. Transport Committee

Lenny Lawrence submitted a written report. He would take action on two issues reported.

11. The Adopt-a-street Scheme

Launch of Aberdeenshire wide Adopt a Street took place in the Market Square on Monday 11th June. In the existing Stonehaven scheme, roughly 1/3 of the area is being covered. There are currently 50 volunteers. The Committee is still looking for more.

12. Major items from the Future of Stonehaven work programme

A productive meeting was held at Mackie Academy on the 4th of June to consider what was meant by changing Mackie Academy into a Community School. The School was keen to ensure that they are involved in sports developments within the town, and wish to see joint projects. They did however state that they are somewhat frustrated with ideas being started but not followed through and would like to try and ensure a path is navigated to prevent plans falling through. The Director of Education Learning and Leisure, Bruce Robinson, is happy to continue to try to make Mackie Academy a Community school. Minutes of the meeting are available. Further meetings are to be organized.

This Community Council calls on the owner of the Former Stonehaven Radio Station Site to take early action to ensure that it is maintained and kept secure, in line with its listed building status.

The Community Council notes that for the past year, prior to and since the opening of the Redcloak Civic Centre, the level of fly tipping at the Queen Elizabeth Park Recycling Point has been and continues to be unacceptable. This creates a bad impression on visitors to one of Aberdeenshire's tourist areas, is a health hazard, and is an example of anti-social behaviour.

The Community Council understood that the large blue cardboard skip was a temporary facility installed to handle the immediate demand for cardboard recycling under the new waste arrangements at the end of 2005 and that this particular facility would be removed once Redcloak was open. It is this facility that seems to be an aggravating cause of large amounts of cardboard and bags of household rubbish being left at the site.

The Community Council is aware and welcomes the fact that Aberdeenshire Council are now monitoring this site during June and will come up with recommendations for a solution at the end of this exercise. As part of this review process, the Community Council would like the following measures to be considered

- *the cardboard skip should be removed*
- *screening should be erected around the site*
- *CCTV should be installed at least on a temporary basis*
- *signs should be erected explaining the proper use of the site and that improper use can result in prosecution*

Although sports and leisure provision are not viewed as the most significant weaknesses in Stonehaven, no doubt because Stonehaven does have a range of facilities, improvements to what is already provided is the priority when it comes to talking about change in the future. This priority is also linked to the view that development in Stonehaven has been unsustainable with significant population growth not matched by corresponding investment in the facilities provided.

There are already a number of groups in the town either looking to address the shortfall in sport and leisure amenity or with a key interest in them including

- The Steering Group set up by the Trustees of the Recreation Grounds to consider how best to develop and use their assets and adjacent land along the front. Professional consultants are currently undertaking a feasibility study of the options. The Future of Stonehaven Consultation is helping to inform this process and there is also a Community Councillor on this group.
- Members of the Mackie Academy Former Pupils' Rugby Club are looking at developments to improve their own club provision, together with other interested groups, so that a sustainable sports facility or club house might be offered west of the A90.
- The Mackie Academy presents considerable potential given its extensive grounds. Recent conversations with the Academy indicate that improving sports provision at the school, through a new purpose-built sports facility for the benefit of both the school and community, would be hugely welcome if ever a financial model for achieving such improvements could be worked out.
- The Community Development Group is to undertake an audit of the town's facilities.
- PARCS, who have already contributed to improvements in the provision of local playground equipment at Queen Elizabeth Park, continue to support the Skate Park Committee which has been working to provide a Skate Park for Stonehaven for some years now.
- Aberdeenshire Council which has a key role as it determines the use of developer contributions and is currently the primary provider of leisure and sporting facilities in the town.

- Stonehaven Towns Partnership which was recently established might be a forum in which the many sports/leisure/recreation groups might discuss common problems and solutions to their particular needs for improved facilities.

Given the above groups and their particular roles, the Community Council is not going to be a lead player in bringing about sport and leisure improvements but it needs to remain aware of the initiatives and plans under discussion by them so that it can play its part in supporting those ideas that will best help to address the issue. There needs to be open communication and links between these groups to ensure a strategy is pursued that makes best use of all the available land for the different purposes required.

Through its role in the Stonehaven Towns Partnership, its representation on the Steering Group of the Recreation Grounds and its contact with the Mackie Academy, the Community Council is currently well placed to monitor developments and offer support. Further specific action is not necessary in the short term.
